**PRESBYTERY OF GRAND CANYON**  
**November 13, 2004 Stated Presbytery Meeting**

**I. Council Report to Presbytery of Actions Taken October 7, 2004**

The Council of the Presbytery of Grand Canyon met for its Stated Meeting at Westminster Presbyterian Church, Phoenix. After determining that a quorum was present, Kate Wilmoth opened the meeting with prayer and a brief devotional at 12:30 PM.

**COUNCIL STUDY TIME**

Council members broke into small groups to discuss a handout in the Council packet titled: *Council Members' Commitments to Each Other*. After which time, they came back together to share observations from their discussion and suggestions for revision. The question was asked: "How many people were here in 1996 when the guidelines were written?" It was agreed that these guidelines should be reviewed at the beginning of each year. Kate Wilmoth offered to build on the comments from this study time and to revise the guidelines. She invited Council members to continue to give her input on what to add to the material.

**COUNCIL MEETING**

**MINUTES & AGENDA APPROVED**

The minutes of the September 2, 2004 meeting were approved as presented.

**TREASURER'S REPORT**

Shirley Randolph reviewed the printed Financial Report for the period ending September 30, 2004, which reflected that year-to-date income versus expense shows a balance of \$38,505.95.

It was reported that the Audited Statement from Henry & Horne, P.L.C. has been received for the year ending December 31, 2003. Upon motion of Council the report will be made a part of the November 13, 2004 Presbytery Minutes.

**ACTION ITEMS**

**PERSONNEL/BUDGET COMMITTEE**

**Recommendations re: Ministry to the Rural Poor**

José Bibiloni and Mary Chavez participated in the last Budget Committee meeting to discuss the Ministry to the Rural Poor and shared their concerns about replacing the former Director, Renato Alvarez (who has moved to Austin to further his education). There is no official Board of Directors for the Rural Poor Center. As a result of that meeting, the Budget Committee made the following recommendations:

**MOTION**

That we proceed with a process for establishing a Board of Directors for the Center.

Suggestions were made as to who might serve on the Board, and how it would be established. After opportunity for discussion, the following Amended Motion was presented and APPROVED.

**AMENDED MOTION**

That Council appoint Cecil Patterson, to proceed in the work that might be necessary to form a Board of Directors for the Ministry to the Rural Poor and provide a status report at the next council meeting.

**MOTION**

On recommendation of the Budget Committee, Council APPROVED the splitting of expense for the director position as follows for 2005: Council will pay 80% of expenses for the Director of Ministry to the Rural Poor, and the Agua Fria Center will pay 20%.

## **MOTION**

On recommendation of the Personnel Committee, Council APPROVED to proceed with the search process for calling a new Director to the Rural Poor Ministry. The Hispanic Ministries Committee has updated the job description and they will continue serving as committee liaison for this ministry.

Council recessed. Trustees Convened.

## **TRUSTEE ITEMS**

### **Morning Star Presbyterian Church**

On the recommendation of the Property Committee, Trustees APPROVED the request of the Morning Star Presbyterian Church steering committee to actively pursue the purchase of one of the three church sites identified as desirable from their search process.

On the recommendation of the Property Committee, Trustees APPROVED the request of the same steering committee to list for sale the property originally designated as a church site on Reems Road in Surprise.

### **University Presbyterian Church**

On recommendation of the Property Committee, Trustees APPROVED the request of University Presbyterian Church to consolidate and extend their GA Loan by \$200,000 to provide for physical repairs and modification of their facility.

### **First Presbyterian Church, Mesa and Kingman Presbyterian Church**

On recommendation of the Property Committee, Trustees APPROVED the actions of the Presbyterian Church (USA) Investment & Loan Program in modifying the loan provisions for First Presbyterian Church, Mesa and Kingman Presbyterian Church

### **Ganado Presbyterian Church**

On recommendation of the Property Committee, Trustees AUTHORIZED the use of the funds in Restricted Fund #22343, Northern Arizona Wind Damage, for use in the replacement of the roof at Ganado Presbyterian Church, if needed, and/or other uses consistent with the intent of the gift.

Trustees recessed, Council reconvened.

## **EXECUTIVE PRESBYTER REPORT**

Ken Moe referred to written report that was in the Council packet and highlighted the following:

### **BRUBAKER SURVEY**

(Enclosed in the packet was a draft letter from Judicatory Executives.) David Brubaker is a Mennonite who has worked in Arizona as a conflict mediator. He would like to survey congregations in Grand Canyon and de Cristo Presbyteries as a part of his doctoral dissertation. Ken has met with him and is enthusiastic about this project. He recommends that the Council endorse it.

After opportunity for discussion, Council endorsed the Brubaker Survey project.

## **ICC UPDATE**

(Letters and notes pertaining to the possible sale of the property to Luke Land were enclosed in the packet.) The figures presented do not look promising, but according to Don Swanson, should be viewed as a starting point for negotiation. The estimated lease rate of \$16.45 per square foot is more than our current rate of \$16.00. Even when adding 200 square feet for the Presbyterian Foundation, the rate comes to \$16.11. Assuming a rate of \$16.00, the proposed annual 3% increase would result in a rate of \$18.00 in the fifth year of a lease.

## **LETTER TO THE ARIZONA REPUBLIC**

A letter was included in the packet that was sent to the *Arizona Republic*, in respect to the presidential debate in Tempe. It emanated from a group of interfaith leaders in Arizona who are concerned about border issues.

Ken Moe included it in his report because he is a signatory to the letter. It is unknown if the *AZ Republic* will publish the letter, but either way, the Council is informed about it.

#### **REPORT OF THE STATED CLERK**

Dick Coffelt highlighted some of the 16 Proposed Amendments to the Constitution that the Presbytery will be voting on in March. There will be a report from the Bills and Overtures Committee in January outlining what the Amendments are.

There is a 12-page document on Actions of the 216<sup>th</sup> GA related to governing bodies. This information will be posted on the presbytery website.

Dick requested an excused absence from the November Council Meeting, as he will be attending the Fall Polity Conference in Sacramento. He will be leading a workshop on Validating Ministries with Bill Tabor.

#### **REPORT OF ASSOCIATE FOR NATIVE AMERICAN MINISTRIES**

(Two articles were included in the Council Packet: Howard Rice's column in the Summer 2004 Cook College and Theological School's newsletter; an introduction to *Sisters Born of Hope* from The Rev. Rosemary McCombs Maxey, Editor of the *Mosaic Series*.)

Judy Wellington highlighted the role that Howard Rice is serving at Cook and in the Native American community. Cook is active in outreach onto the reservations with student body and staff. In 2005 the Native American Ministries Committee will be looking at ways to make more use of Cook College.

The article from Rosemary McCombs is from a UCC publication, and she shared it with Council members to show what other denominations are doing in terms of Native American life. One of the women's stories was by a graduate of the Ganado School.

#### **REPORT OF ASSOCIATE FOR CONGREGATIONAL RESOURCING**

José Olagues referred to his written report and highlighted the following:

Planning for future Mission Opportunities. During the first full week in September José toured New Church Development (NCD) sites of Iglesia Nacional Presbiteriana de Mexico (Mexican National Presbyterian Church) in the neighboring state of Sonora. The small delegation sponsored by The Synod of The Southwest included two members of the Stewardship Mission and Communications Development Committee (SMCD). It is the intent of SMCD to offer opportunities to the congregations in our presbytery to do mission in/with these NCD's.

Although Presbyterianism has been well established in Southern Mexico its presence is relatively new in the Northern region. Our host while visiting Mexico was Compañeros en Mission (Compañeros). Compañeros is one of the seven ministries of the Presbyterian Border Ministry, which is a bi-national cooperative ministry of Iglesia Nacional Presbiteriana de Mexico and Presbyterian Church (USA). Compañeros is the only one of the seven ministries which expands its work beyond the immediate border region. It works with the National Mexican Church in strengthening NCD's in one of the largest states in the Mexican Republic, Sonora. The sites visited included Nogales, Caborca, Hermosillo, Guaymas & Navojoa.

Continuing Education. He participated in an international conference in Migration and Theology at Notre Dame in Indiana. Though he was in a denominational minority he was a delighted to be part of a large (400) forum addressing many aspects of migration worldwide mostly in a Roman Catholic context. The rich morning prayers and Eucharistic Celebrations at The Basilica on Campus added to the experience. He was particularly impressed by the commitment to migrant ministries worldwide by the order of John Baptist Scalabrini. The evenings were devoted to multimedia presentations. He commended to Council the soon to be released commercial film "The Gatekeeper."

Funding for mission support. In the Spring, council was advised of two proposals forwarded from this presbytery to Synod for further consideration for funding from GA Restricted Funds. Both proposals were

found “worthy” by the synod reviewing committee, and both of the proposals have been approved for funding.

Congregational transformation. Interest continues to be shown to begin discussing possibilities of transforming ministries in our congregations. One of our sessions had discussed the topic and recently held a Saturday retreat to expand the conversation beyond the session to other leaders in the congregation.

Miscellaneous. In addition to other presbytery activities such as participation in an installation service, José covered the pulpit at Yarnell Community PC on Sun 10/12. He took the opportunity to address stewardship while this congregation wrestles with a “problem” of growth.

That there be a lighting of a peace candle at every presbytery meeting. The lighting of the peace candle will be preceded by, highlighting an area in the world where peace is needed. We would then light the candle and participate in reading a litany prepared for this purpose.

Southminster will be having a celebration on Friday night before the presbytery meeting and on Sunday morning as part of the culmination of their 50<sup>th</sup> Celebration. All are invited to attend.

### **COMMITTEE ON NOMINATIONS**

Nominations for elders to serve are needed for this committee (2 male, 2 female). Brant Baker and Gloria Wilson volunteered to provide names to nominate for the Committee on Nominations.

### **MINUTES OF SEPTEMBER 2004 PRESBYTERY MEETING**

Council members received a printed copy of the Minutes of the September 17-18, 2004 Presbytery Meeting in the Council Packet. After opportunity for discussion, Council APPROVED the Minutes of the September 17-18, 2004 Presbytery Meeting on behalf of the Presbytery.
